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2. Conflicts of Interest

A conflict of interest occurs when someone in a position of trust has competing professional and personal interests and these competing interests make it difficult to fulfill their professional duties impartially. A conflict of interest exists even if no unethical or improper act results from it. Conflicts of interest may be actual or perceived. An actual conflict of interest occurs when a decision or action would be compromised without taking immediate appropriate action to eliminate the conflict. A perceived conflict of interest is any situation in which a reasonable person would conclude that conflicting duties or loyalties exists.

3. Conflicts of Interest

An individual conflict of interest occurs when any of the following conditions is present: 1) An applicant or potential grantee uses his/her status to obtain special advantage, benefit, or access to the Society for American Archaeology; 2) An applicant is an employee or board member of the Society or is an immediate family member of an employee or board member of the SAA. Instances in which the applicant worked in a volunteer capacity for the SAA should be evaluated on a case by case basis. Volunteer status has the potential to, but does not necessarily create a conflict of interest, depending on the nature of the relationship between the two parties. An organizational conflict of interest occurs when: an applicant or potential grantee is unable or potentially unable to render impartial assistance or advice to the SAA due to competing duties or loyalties; a grantee's objectivity in carrying out the grant is or might be otherwise impaired due to competing duties or loyalties; or a grantee has an unfair competitive advantage through being furnished unauthorized proprietary information or source selection information that is not available to all competitors/applicants.
